Debt and the Scriptures

Poverty and debt in the ancient world were usually due to a poor harvest, or the death of a husband resulting in no income for the family. There were many issues with loans for goods and property as far back as the exodus from Egypt and the journey to the Promised Land.

In the Old Testament many references are literal ones covering what should be done or not done with money-lending and debt. For example, in Deuteronomy 15 creditors were instructed every seventh year to release debtors from their loans. They were to remember God's kindness – that all people were debtors without God's gifts; that to obey God's word meant making sure there were no poor among them; that trusting in God's blessing should be greater than calling in debts; and that they should love God's people, seeing them as part of their own family where debt

was concerned. And Leviticus 25 instructs that every 50th year should be a jubilee year when, for example, property sold to pay off debts should be returned.

In the New Testament, both debt and money are used as metaphors in parables to describe such things as forgiveness and love, and to teach people what these mean. In particular, in Matthew 18 the parable of the unmerciful servant reminds us that we must forgive our neighbours their sins; and in Luke 16 we are warned that money is not a possession, but something to be used for the good of others with faithful trust in God.

In reading either or both the literal and metaphorical teachings of scripture on money and debt we need to consider how these instruct us what we must do in order to spread the gospel about a subject that many struggle to see as having anything to do with Christian stewardship of the world.

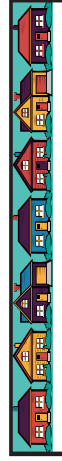

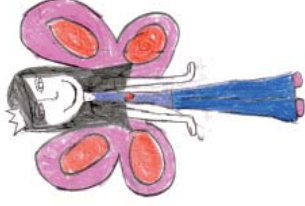

Hi my name is Daisy.

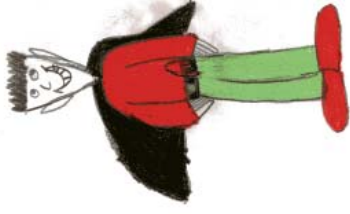
I always gossip about Puck, Titania, Oberon and other people. It is so cool when Titania and Oberon are arguing.

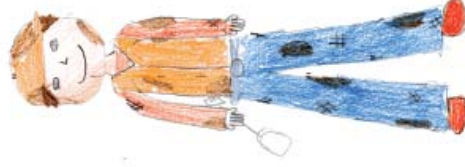

Lavender Biscuits

If you have lavender in your garden, do try these delicious August biscuits! They come out soft when warm from the oven, and 'crisp up' as they cool down. Goes well with a rich creamy desert such as syllabub or ice cream.

Use: 225g unsalted butter, softened; 110 g caster sugar; 175 g self-raising flour; 1 medium egg, well beaten; 1 tbspd dried lavender flowers (Makes 20-24 biscuits.)

What to do: Pre-heat your oven to 180C/ Gas Mark 4. Cream butter and sugar in bowl until light and fluffy. Add a spoonful of flour to prevent curdling, then mix in the beaten egg. Stir in flour and lavender flowers, mixing well. Drop teaspoons of the mixture, spaced well apart, on to baking trays lined with parchment paper. Bake for about 15 minutes until the biscuits are brown around the edge and golden yellow in the centre. You'll need to do several batches. Leave to cool on baking tray for several minutes. Then use spatula to transfer to a rack.

Putting Out The Light

Traditional light bulbs are doomed. A recent Brussels summit has declared they are to be phased out in the battle against climate change.

Within two years the old-style incandescent filament bulbs are to be replaced by more energy efficient compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs). They use 67 per cent less electricity, and last four times longer. The Government calculates that if every British household were to replace three 60 to 100 watt light bulbs with CFLs the energy saving would be greater than the power used by the country's entire street lighting network.

The drawbacks are that the new CFLs are more expensive, take longer to switch on, require more energy to make, and contain mercury.

Gardening Tips For June



Thin spring-sown hardy annuals to six inches apart and prop up tall varieties with link stakes. Boost growth of herbaceous plants by watering the root area fortnightly with quick Miracle Grow or the like. Continue planting out summer bedding annuals. Prune flowered forsythia, shorten a third of older shoots to near ground level. Mow lawns twice a week when possible. Keep up the watering as and when possible. Disbud hybrid tea roses, this helps for better buds later. Lift white outdoor Christmas roses, part them and move them to a warm place, you will get pristine snow-white blooms.

The church, built in the perpendicular style, is in a beautiful setting with wonderful views across the valley, and is full of interesting features. The first vicar was William de Kaynsham in 1226. The church, which was originally about the same size as the present chancel, dates from 1236, and the only original parts remaining are the chancel, the font and the main door. The Nave, Aisle, and Bell Tower were added during the 15th century. Major restoration work was sympathetically carried out by the Victorians in 1863, and the church is well worth visiting to view the beautiful Windows, Chandeliers and Ceilings.

St Andrew's Mother's Union, Banwell meet on the second Wednesday of every month at 2.30p.m. in the Village Hall. Our meetings take the form of a short service followed by a guest speaker, and then tea and biscuits, or sometimes an outing as above. If you think you might be interested in what goes on please come to one of our meetings, we are a very friendly group and visitors are always welcome.

to South Africa earlier this year as a delegate to the TEAM Conference (Towards Effective Anglican Mission).

On August 18th Barry Mather will be showing a Power Point presentation on the history of the Mothers' Union followed by a picture story of our Lady Day Service and our visit to St James' the Great, Winscombe.
