On Wednesday June 14th our branch set off for our Summer Outing. This year we enjoyed a very chatty lunch catching up with all our news as the branch had not met since March. We lunched at the Plough Inn, Wrington which is under new management and currently being refurbished. However we were made very welcome and everyone enjoyed their meal as the new chef is already there.

We then visited All Saint's Church, Wrington and were welcomed by The Rev. Nicholas Maddock, the incumbent, who gave a brief introduction about the current situation at All Saint's. They are in receipt of bequest of over a million pounds which will allow considerable repairs and refurbishment.

Our previous Deanery President, Eve Collins, assisted by her husband Ken then gave us an interesting description of previous rectors and their influence on the parish. One of whom managed to avoid the main turnpike road, now the A38, from being routed through the village. As a Banwellian one looks with some envy at the delightful village free from heavy traffic and HGV's!

Wrington belonged to the Benedictine Abbots of Glastonbury from approx. 926AD until the Dissolution of the Monasteries during the time of Henry VIII. The masons of the abbey built the famous west tower between 1420 and 1450. The towers of Somerset churches are rightly famous. Wrington's tower was architect Charles Berry's inspiration for the Victoria tower

of the Houses of Parliament when they were rebuilt in 1835 after a disastrous fire. Charles Berry also designed the beautifully carved delicate Neo-Gothic style Caen Stone Reredos behind the altar in 1832 which a local craftsman John White sculpted. The 16th Century oak screen was saved from destruction by the intervention of the Rector and extends to the full width of the church. The Rev. John Vane is said to have leapt upon his horse at Burrington and galloped to Wrington where he protested to such effect that the Victorian 'restorers' decided to retain the screen.[1859] The history of the interior of Wrington is something of a salutary lesson of following all the current fashions in religious worship, from the Dissolution, to the Puritanical times to the Restoration and then the Victorian restorers. It will be interesting to see what develops as a result of the new bequest.

There are two very notable people associated with Wrington Church. Hannah More [1745-1833] is well know here and in Banwell for her efforts to establish schools for the working people in the Mendip villages. She encouraged female Friendly Societies! the forerunner of our national insurance, to help people in times of sickness and old age etc. and Sunday Schools. Many of her schools were attacked. Her Sunday School at Blagdon was attacked by the local clergyman as setting up a secret religious meeting!!! There is a stone bust and marble memorial to her in the church and her grave is in the church yard.

New Methodist President Calls For Renewal

The Revd Graham Carter, new President of the Methodist Conference, has called on the Church to take up the challenge of discipleship. Graham told the recent Methodist Conference: "the kingdom needs wholehearted disciples. Nothing must be allowed to get in the way."

Graham said that too often the church has equated discipleship with holding office or doing some work. "This is nonsense!" he told the packed hall at the Edinburgh Conference Centre. "Christ calls all his people to serve him with the whole of their lives." This discipleship is about how you live at work, at home and in the community.

Graham said this is a tough challenge, and the role of the Church should be to provide practical support for people's discipleship in a complex world.

The Methodist Church is the third-largest Christian church serving Great Britain, with nearly 300,000 members and regular contact with over 800,000 people. It has about 5,800 churches in Great Britain, and also maintains links with other Methodist churches totalling a worldwide membership of 70 million.

Are You Happy?

Happiness levels are on the slide. Recent research has found that happiness levels are declining and more personal wealth has not brought with it more wellbeing.

The proportion of people saying they are 'very happy' is 36 per cent, compared with 52 per cent in 1957, and eight out of ten people want the Government to make us happier.

Experts say that the relentless pursuit of economic growth has exacted a high price from the national psyche, leaving behind it depression and emotional impoverishment. They argue that if you ask people what makes them happy, the most important things are relationships.

The poll by GFK NOP found that more than 36 per cent of people are 'very happy', and 56 per cent consider themselves 'fairly happy' but five per cent were 'fairly unhappy' and three per cent 'very unhappy'. A similar poll by Gallup in 1957 found that 52 percent were very happy and 42 per cent fairly happy.

Are you planning to do any DIY this month? If so, please be careful!

More than 200,000 DIY enthusiasts need hospital treatment each year, it has been revealed. Now The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents has issued a top 10 list of tools most likely to land handymen in casualty.

Predictably, knives and scalpels are at the top: accounting for 20,000 hospital cases last year. But even the lowly screwdriver sent 3,500 people to A & E in one year alone.

Power tools accounted for a staggering 87,000 injuries last year. But just hanging wallpaper landed a further 1,500 people in hospital. Even cleaning the windows is dangerous: 30,000 end up in hospital each year after falling off ladders and stepladders.

The top ten tools to watch out for are: knives and scalpels, saws, grinders, hammers, chisels, screwdrivers, power drills, axes, planes, and welding gear.
