# **Two Jazz Giants** Gardening Tips **For June**

# William Tyndale

William Tyndale's burning ambition was to translate the Bible into English so that even the ploughboy could read the Scriptures. Betrayed and imprisoned for the work he had begun as a boy, in 1535 he wrote in Latin to the prison governor of Vilvorde Castle for a few essentials to help him with his study.

"I beg your lordship, and that by the Lord Jesus, that if I am to remain here through the winter you will request the commissary to have the kindness to send me, from the goods of mine which he has, a warmer cap; for I suffer greatly from cold in the head... I ask to be allowed to have a lamp in the evening; it is indeed wearisome sitting alone in the dark. But most of all I beg and beseech your clemency, that he will kindly permit me to have the Hebrew Bible, Hebrew grammar, and Hebrew dictionary, that I may pass the time in study."

Early in October 1536, Tyndale was led out of the castle towards the southern gate of the town. The sun had barely risen above the horizon when he was brought before the authorities and a final appeal was made that he should recant. Tyndale stood immovable. A silence fell over the crowd as they watched the lean form and thin face of the prisoner; his lips moved with a final impassioned prayer: "Lord, open the King of England's eyes."

With that, they chained him to a cross on a pyre and burnt him alive. He began and was still working on what is acknowledged to be the greatest Bible translation of all time whose words have passed irrevocably into our spirits and our own rich language and heritage. It is God's story.





# St. Andrew's Church Now and Long Ago

The new priest who will be in charge at St. Andrew's for five years (as mentioned in the last Parish News) has yet to be selected but he, or she, can be assured of coming to a friendly welcoming church.

An increase in congregation is always hoped for; but thanks to Churchwardens, Lay Readers, and excellent visiting clergy, services during the interregnum have continued uninterrupted. The number of christenings has spiralled upwards; communion is taken as usual; Christmas, Mothering Sunday and Easter were very special occasions; and, of course, the church, with its fine architecture and beautiful carved screen, remains a wonderful place for weddings.

Traditionally many Banwell families have their own long cherished memories of weddings and christenings at St. Andrew's; and from ancient records we can look back even farther. We may not know when the first Banwell Church marriage was held; or even when Banwell first had a church. But we can be sure that over the centuries St. Andrew's has been the setting for thousands of local christenings, marriages, and funerals; creating a shared bond among the families who, in olden times, made Banwell their home over several generations.

Historically; if for example we look back to Saxon times, (and there is a carved Saxon stone in the church porch) we find that Banwell in the time of King Alfred the Great had already become a 'Minster' (or 'Mother') church. Later there would be daughter chapels in Winthill, Puxton, Compton Bishop, and Churchill. Banwell had become a place of importance; and in religious matters was playing a prominent part.

When the vast Sherborne (West Wessex) diocese was split up to form smaller, more manageable, Bishoprics the Diocese of Wells was created; and Banwell was one of the parishes included; the Bishop afterwards acquiring the additional position of Lord of the Manor. Naturally, with the setting up of this new Diocese, came frequent visits by the Bishop, acting in his dual capacity of spiritual and manorial head. Manor Court business, in particular, frequently required him to stay at Banwell for a week or more at a time; and it is not surprising that he needed a fine house to be built for his use alongside the church. Over the years fishponds, a deer park, and a rabbit warren would eventually be included in the grounds; but since those days there has been much rebuilding and remodelling, as well as changes of ownership and of name. At one time known as The Palace, or The Courthouse, the Bishop's house has long been replaced by the private residence well known to everyone as Banwell Abbey. St. Andrew's itself has seen much re-building and re-styling since the Saxon times.

Anyone wishing to share in worship can be assured of a warm welcome.
