My dear friends,

Standing in Sainsbury's check-out queue in Worle, I overheard a conversation. Two ladies bemoaning the fact that church work is a thankless business, and at the time, had they asked me, I would have been inclined to have agreed with them.

However, driving home and brooding over my spot of eavesdropping, I remembered a little volume of essays I found many years ago while browsing through a secondhand bookshop. One passage in this book had been underlined, and it was where the author, Frank Boreham, talked of onions.

It was explained that although the onion is the most valuable to a thousand dishes, no one ever praises it. No one ever waxes lyrical in poetry about the onion's virtues, as authors have done from time to time about daffodils, roses, etc. The reason the author gave for this is that the onion is strong, and no one thinks of praising or growing sentimental over great strong things, although many a tear has been shed over an onion!

It doesn't necessarily follow that because we're not being praised we're not being appreciated. Perhaps we should have a picture of an onion pinned up in our church porches. Such a reminder would have cheered up my two ladies who started all this.

Never underestimate the power of your ac-

tions, based on the love of God. With one small gesture you can change a person's life, for better or for worse. God puts us all in each other's lives to impact one another in some way. Look for God in others.

In happy moments, praise God; in difficult moments, seek God; in quiet moments, worship God; in painful moments, trust God; in every moment, thank God.

Children’s Centres are being developed to improve outcomes for all children and families throughout North Somerset. The Centres will offer easy access to children’s services in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere.

They are designed to bring together education, childcare, family support and health services in an accessible way and are being developed locally around existing early years and childcare provision.

Current Children’s Centres development will be established by reconfiguring current services, through refurbishment of existing buildings. The 8 recommended locations in North Somerset are centred on Weston-super-Mare Central, Worle, Banwell/Winscombe, Clevedon, Portishead, Congresbury/Yatton, Nailsea/Backwell and Long Ashton.

The Youth & Community Centre in Banwell is the recommended location near you.

Redevelopment of the building is an exciting project, working in conjunction with the Parish Council and the Youth Team.

Gardening Tips For June



Thin out annuals to prevent overcrowding. Check regularly to see if plants need watering hanging baskets

and small containers may need watering every day. Maintain a programme of weeding and pest control. Sow seeds of fast-maturing annuals, spring - flowering biennials, herbs and vegetables. Plant out summer bedding and other seedlings and cuttings. Feed plants in borders if not already done. Ensure the greenhouse and conservatory has adequate shading and ventilation. Put net on the fruit cages over soft fruit and vegetable crops as they come into season.

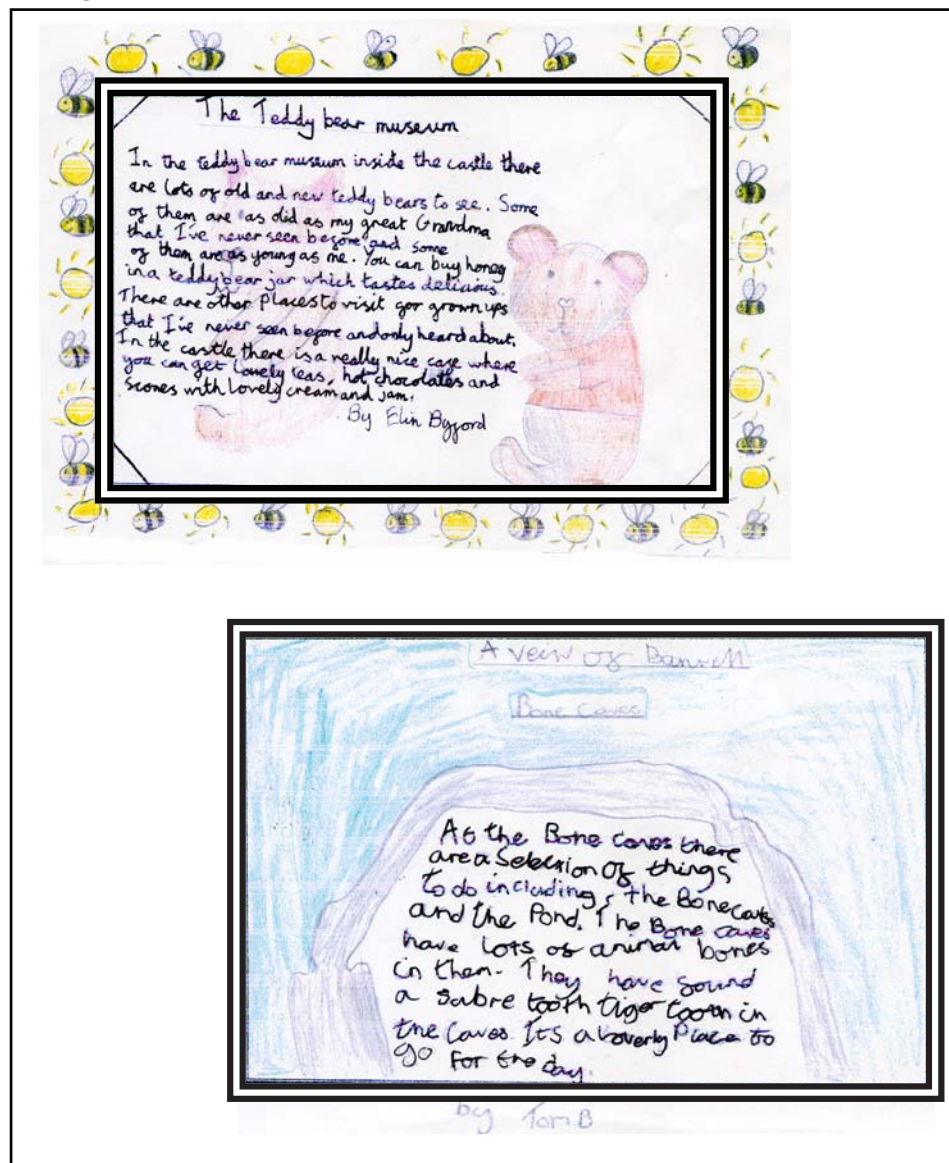
A Limb To Far

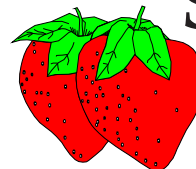

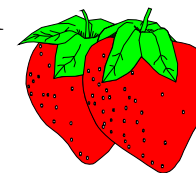

Bible Puzzle

Can you find 30 books of the Bible in the following?

This is a most remarkable puzzle. It was found by a gentleman, in an airplane seat pocket, on a flight from Los Angeles to Honolulu, keeping him occupied for hours. He enjoyed it so much that he passed it on to some friends. One friend from Illinois worked on this while fishing from his john-boat. Another friend studied it while playing his banjo. Elaine Taylor, a columnist friend, was so intrigued by it she mentioned it in her weekly newspaper column. Another friend judges the job of solving this puzzle so involving, she brews a cup of tea to help her nerves.
