Think Thin

A survey by the Priory Group, which specialises in treating people with mental health and behavioural disorders, has found that many of us turn to food for comfort. This most often happens after an argument with someone, or when we have on-going problems with our partners.

63 per cent of the adults questioned admitted that when they feel overweight, it affects their self-esteem, yet 52 per cent will still turn to chocolate (the favourite food drug) for comfort. Others seek solace in cakes and pastries, or crisps and nuts.

Dr Peter Rowan, consultant psychiatrist at the Priory Hospital, Roehampton, believes that many people use comfort food as a form of self-medication. "These people are desperate to fill the void created by loneliness, low self-esteem, depression and insecurity. You could say they are 'hungry for love'."

Gardening Tips For November



Cover vulnerable plants growing outdoors with cloches or horticultural fleece. If severe frost is fore-

cast, protect newly planted trees and shrubs over the winter with windbreaks. Clear out, and take under cover, containers that are not frost-hardy. Plant any remaining tulips and hyacinths without delay. Cut lawns for the last time this year, weather permitting, then clean mower and stow away. Prepare for autumn and winter gales by removing dead or decaying branches on established tree. Clear fallen leaves and other debris so slugs and snails have nowhere to over-winter.
