Fireworks

Every year, hundreds of horses are killed and seriously injured by fireworks. They do not understand that humans are having fun. The noise terrifies them and they try to gallop away. Horses in fields run into barbed wire and wooden fences or try to jump them, getting caught up, torn, impaled or falling and breaking their legs, often suffering horribly before owners or vets can get to them. Horses who break their legs have to be put down. Horses in stables throw themselves against walls or stand shaking in fear.

Horses and ponies are quite different from humans, dogs and cats. They are “flight” animals. Their response to anything frightening is to run away, as fast as possible.

Unlike cats and dogs, many of whom are also very frightened by fireworks, horses cannot easily be sedated or brought into the house for comfort. It is cruel to make them suffer like this and heartbreaking for owners, who love their horses very much, to watch their distress.

There are many horses and ponies in fields and stables all around our Parish. PLEASE, don't let off fireworks anywhere near fields or farms around the village. Consider going to the big organised displays in town instead of having your own. Most people don't realise how much suffering fireworks cause to all animals, particularly horses. But now that you know, if you really want to have fireworks in your back garden, it would be very much appreciated if you would let your neighbours know when and at what time – and to choose the quietest ones you can find.

Super Carers

The numbers of women in their forties and fifties who are caught between the demands of holding down a job and looking after a younger or older relative will rise by 50 per cent by 2020, according to a recent study.

This so-called ‘sandwich’ generation is trapped by falling birth rates and increasing longevity. More and more of these women are taking on the role of a ‘super carer’ – looking after both children or grandchildren and elderly relatives at the same time.

It puts a huge strain on the ‘have it all’ generation of women who were supposed to have more personal freedom and greater wealth than their predecessors.

Currently there are an estimated 2.5million ‘super carers’ in the UK, but the figure is expected to rise to 3.9 million. Most are aged between 45 and 55, and as super carers, face increased stresses which have an adverse effect on their overall health, wealth and well-being.

Archbishop On Childhood

The Archbishop, as patron of the Children's Society, has spoken out on the difficulties children face in the 21st Century, has launched The Good Childhood Inquiry. Dr Rowan Williams spoke about the pressure children face at a school with excessive testing, as well as the commercial pressures they face by being targeted as consumers before they are ready. “I think we have a shared unwillingness in our culture to let children be children for long enough”.

Gardening Tips For October



Plant winter lettuce in cold frames, keep well ventilated, protect against slugs.

Any long-term pot plants that will not be rested through the winter should be checked over. If you intend to plant roses the job should be finished by mid-November. Lift and divide herbaceous perennials, – early flowering types are best dealt with now. Start digging as the ground becomes vacant in the vegetable plot. Biennials such as Foxgloves, Canterbury Bells and Honesty can be planted where they are to flower next year. Splash out and treat yourselves to an extra bag of tulips which can be planted before mid-November.



After our fallow, or holiday month, we returned to our normal branch meeting at the village hall. The nights are drawing in and we are now enjoying the fresher air of Autumn. The heats of this summer seem to have brought on an early fruit harvest despite the periods of dry weather. The blackberries and apples are earlier and the plums have been quite profuse. The theme of our service was our grateful thanks to God for the gifts of Autumn. The bible reading was read by Beryl and was from Deuteronomy Chapter 28 verses 1-9. Hilary read a prayer of Autumn praise and Josie a prayer for God our Creator and the blessings of the harvest. As we prayed for our sisters in the world-wide MU we reminded ourselves that many of our members face starvation through drought and political unrest.

Our Speaker was The Revd Brian Blanford. This was a most interesting autobiographical discourse about how he became a Baptist Minister for over thirty years. As a boy he lived near an Anglican Church in Bristol and, like many of his generation, attended Sunday School and became a choir boy. Then followed National Service in the RAF. He was given a parting present of a little book of Daily Christian Readings by our very own Betty Griffey. This had quite an effect. When in the RAF, he and a friend would walk to the nearest Church of England Church on a Sunday evening. One evening they were late and popped into the nearer Methodist Church. One of Brian's clear messages was

that there should be no divisions between Christians. How true. We have been struggling with such divisions ever since Henry VIII, some 470 years ago. Thank goodness such divisions no longer have people being burnt at the stake! Efforts are now made to be more ecumenical representing the whole Christian world, or universal church. Even today we see the divisions of Christianity in Ireland. There are the same divisions in Islam, as we see in the Middle East. What a shame it all is when the very word Islam means peace, and Jesus was the Prince of peace and love.

Brian went on to say how various people had touched his life and influenced his future so that he progressed into the ministry. He said that often we are quite unaware how profoundly we are influencing those we meet as we travel through our lives.

I was much taken with the link between what he was saying and the personal prayer of our founder, Mary Sumner.

"All this day, O Lord, let me touch as many lives as possible for thee; and every life I touch, do thou by thy spirit quicken, whether though the word I speak, the prayer I breathe, or the life I live. Amen.
